**Bruegel** (Brussels European and Global Economic Laboratory) is a **European think tank devoted to policy research in European and international economics**, which has been active in Brussels since 2005. Bruegel seeks to contribute to European and global economic policymaking through open, fact-based and policy-relevant research, analysis and debate. Its statute and governance ensure that, though demand-driven, its research is independent and does not represent any particular interest or policy doctrine.

## BRUEGEL FUNDING

Bruegel is a completely independent research organisation with a unique funding model, composed of annual membership subscriptions from leading international corporations, EU governments and international institutions. No member contributes more than 5% of the total budget and Bruegel's day-to-day work is carried out at arm's lengths from members' interests.

In addition, Bruegel receives some research funding from a variety of institutions including the German Marshall Fund of the United States. Bruegel currently cooperates with think tanks and research institutions in Europe, the US, East Asia and India.

## BRUEGEL PUBLICATIONS

Since starting operations in 2005, Bruegel has released more than 80 publications covering research areas including budgetary and monetary policies; climate change and energy; European and global governance; currencies and international finance; labour and migration; intellectual property and innovation; competition; trade; new Member States of the EU; enlargement and others.

Bruegel's range of publications includes:



**Essays and Lectures** provide a compact record of the views of scholars and practitioners as they write for, or lecture at, Bruegel events. The series provides the reader with a grounding in the main arguments of a current topic for debate, adding thought-provoking insights.



**Policy Briefs** provide concise, up-to-date analyses targeted towards a policy audience. They are typically eight pages, easy to read and fact-based, with an emphasis on concrete recommendations. Policy Briefs are distributed in both electronic and print formats.



**Books** written or edited by Bruegel scholars are published under the Bruegel Books series. They provide in-depth analysis from a variety of perspectives on a current policy issue and are available online (without charge) or for sale in print form.



**Policy Contributions** are concise contributions to particular policy debates, typically testimonies or hearings, or responses to political consultation papers. They are published online only.



**Working Papers** present research done at, or in cooperation with, Bruegel, which has been presented at conferences, is intended for publication in journals and volumes, or presents methodologies and detailed results underpinning policy-oriented publications.



**Blueprints** are longer reports that provide a comprehensive, in-depth analysis of current policy challenges and set out detailed prescriptions for policy reform.

## BRUEGEL EVENTS

Bruegel holds a series of conferences, workshops, lunchtalks and seminars on different economic topics throughout the year. Several events are co-organised with European institutions, the ministries of Member states and heads of international organisations. Bruegel also collaborates with national policy institutions through the organisation of workshops and conferences and participation in internal seminars, e.g. in national treasuries and central bank

## BRUEGEL GOVERNANCE

Bruegel is governed by a board of 11 individuals with backgrounds in government, business, academia and civil society. The Board appoints the Director and has decision-making powers on Bruegel's strategy, research programme, partnerships and budget but no responsibility for research conclusions and publications.
